Dear friends.



Last Monday was my day off. I have a confession to make—I didn't leave my apartment all day long, I didn't talk to anyone on the telephone, I didn't text, and I didn't check email. I read some things for pleasure, I watched a bit of television, I avoided the news, and I took a nap. You see, what I really longed for that day was solitude. I wanted to avoid the images of war and the hateful comments of people who try to divide us rather than unite us. What I truly wanted was peace! And, yes, I found it by being alone with God.

Now don't get me wrong. I had deep thoughts about the people in Ukraine and Gaza who cannot find that peace. My heart ached at the thought of innocent adults and innocent children whose lives have been turned upside down by people in power who seem to have no soul. I could never fully get away from what is going on in the world around me, because my faith in a loving God will not allow me to be uncaring and unsympathetic to the plight of others. The images of suffering haunt me, and well they should! I am a follower of Jesus Christ, after all, and war and hateful speech and the sowing of division are not a part of his teaching. Quite the contrary.

Jesus calls us to be peacemakers and to love one another. So even in solitude, I cannot avoid the sense of urgency in proclaiming the true message of Jesus! I can avoid television, the telephone, and email, but I cannot avoid the way the Spirit of Christ has molded my heart. It is within that wonderful presence of the Spirit, however, that I can find peace. It doesn't cause me to be oblivious to suffering, and I am well aware of what is happening around me. But I can find personal peace and purpose because of Jesus Christ.

The world needs to understand this kind of peace. Jesus taught it and he lived it. There are numerous examples in the gospels where Jesus "withdrew from the crowds and went up on a hillside to pray." He was confronting suffering and grief; he was challenging powerful leaders who wanted to silence him; and he was inspiring crowds who wanted and needed a message of hope. But in the midst of all of this, he found peace in solitude with God the Father.

To bring things back to our contemporary world, I found an article about two people several years ago who were running for a seat in the Vermont state house of representatives. They were a woman and a man competing for the same seat, coming from different political parties. She was named Lucy, and he was Zac. As the true story goes, at the end of a vigorous public debate over the issues, they asked the moderator for a few extra minutes—not to make partisan appeals to the voters, but rather to make a little music. Lucy grabbed her cello, while Zac picked up his guitar. The audience was

thrilled and loudly cheered with appreciation! You see, Lucy and Zac had agreed early on in their campaigns that they were going to be civil and treat each other with respect throughout the race. They both loved music, and they agreed this would be a nice way to end their debates—on a pleasant, harmonious note.

In the words of Jesus: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:34-35) Amen!

Hometown Highlight: Gospel Hour at The Floyd Country Store

FLOYD COUNTRY STORE





The Floyd Country Store served the community through most of the twentieth century. Although its origins are lost in obscurity it is known that in June 1910 a business called Farmer's Supply opened its doors in the building and the store has remained open ever since.

The store is an incubator for local heritage music and dancing. Year-round you can count on music and dancing every Friday evening, Americana music every Saturday afternoon and a traditional mountain music jam every Sunday. Many Saturday evenings we feature an old-time dance or concert. Some of the finest old-time musicians around turn up on stage at the store, enjoying the energy and enthusiasm of an audience that truly appreciates traditional music.

The Friday Night Jamboree happens every Friday, rain or shine, all year round. The first hour is gospel music and this is followed by two dance bands. We post our upcoming schedules as soon as they are available, so if you see an empty slot, check back soon for updates.



The Jamboree has limited reserved seating and is often standing room only, so come early for seat. Tickets for the Jamboree are sold online and at the door. We open our ticket desk at approximately 4:45PM after we have had time to move all the store fixtures out of the way and set up the chairs. **Stop by and join in with familiar faces dancing, playing and enjoying fellowship along with praising the Lord.**






